After all, God the Father gave us the greatest valentine, His Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord and King, our Savior and Redeemer. "For God so LOVED the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). The word "loved" in this verse is the Greek word "agape." Sometimes you may see an Agape church when driving down the road. The word means "love." My definition of agape is "a selfless, sacrificial concern for the welfare of others that is not called forth by any quality of loveableness in the person loved, but is the product of the will to love in obedience to God's command." And what is that command? John 13:34-35 – "A new command I give you:" says Jesus. "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you 'must' love one another. By this love all men will 'know' that you are My disciples, if you love one another." We are commanded to love as God has loved us. How did God love us? Selflessly. Sacrificially. Full of grace, unmerited favor. Romans 5:8 says, "God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:10 says, "While we were still enemies," Christ died for us. One of my favorite chapters in the Bible is 1 Corinthians 13, the love chapter, if you will. "Love is stient." Be patient with each other in your thoughts, in your words, in your actions.

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"Love is kind. It does not envy. It does not boast." Hey, look at me! "Love is not proud." Never be too proud to say, "I'm sorry. I made a mistake." Never be too proud

to do a menial task for others when asked, even if the football game is on. "Love is not rude. It doesn't dishonor others. Love is not self-seeking," but always other centered. "Love is not easily angered. Love keeps no records of wrongs." These actions are some of the greatest ways you can show agape love to your list of Valentine's recipients. "Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth," and the truth is that you love each other. Don't let Satan, the world, or the flesh deceive you into thinking those close to you don't love you. Hold onto love. "Love always protects, trusts, hopes, and perseveres. Love never fails." Dr. Rev. 


## Dear friends and family,

Lord willing, the next time you hear from us we will be in West Africa.




### **How Can You Give Financial Support**
