Walk in the light as God is in the light (1John 1:7). On Sunday, March12th,
Mississippi will once again "spring forward" one hour at 2 a.m. Be careful. If you forget,
you will miss either Sunday School or worship. Mark your calendars now. This forwarding
of clocks one hour will allow more light in the evening. We Americans crave more light.
We demand more light. But does this longing for more light apply to our spiritual lives?

Jesus says in John 8:12, "I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk
in darkness but have the light of eternal life." Psalm 27:1 says, "The Lord is my light and
my salvation." Do you crave for more of this Light? Do you demand more of this Light?

To receive more light on March 12th, we will move our clocks forward one hour. What are
you willing to move in or out of your life to receive more of the Light of the world, more of
Christ? Do you even recognize a need for more Light in your life?

I love Eliza Hewitt's hymn "More About Jesus." "More about Jesus would I know.

More of His grace to others show. More of His saving fullness see. More of His love Who died for me. More about Jesus let me learn. More of His holy will discern. Spirit of God, my teacher be. Showing the things of Christ to me. More, more about Jesus. More, more about Jesus. More of His saving fullness see. More of His love Who died for me." Eliza Hewitt had an unquenchable and insatiable thirst and desire for more Light in her life. As a moth drawn to a flame, so too all of us should be drawn daily to the Light. Just as a plant

must have light in order to live, so too all of us need the Light in order to live spiritually. I was a Maternity Ward chaplain years ago while in the military. I noticed that newborns with jaundice were placed under a special blue light that would break down the bilirubin which causes the eyes and skin to turn yellow. As Christians, we all need Light therapy to help us to break down and put to death sin in our lives and also to help us to think, speak, and act as becomes God's children. We all must have more Light in our lives.

I am reminded of that great quote from Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. which says, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness. Only light can do that." The apostle John reminds us in 1 John 1:5 that God is light. In our battle against Satan, the world, and the flesh, I hope you recognize the great necessity of receiving more Light in your life to dispel the darkness, and I pray you are doing everything you can to receive more of Jesus. In Philippians 3:8, the apostle Paul wrote that he considered everything a loss that he might know Christ more, that he might receive more Light. Everything a loss. Do you consider everything a loss that you might receive more of the Light of the world?

So, I am going to ask you again to put on your thinking caps and answer the question, "What do you need to move, like moving the clocks forward one hour, in or out of your life to receive more Light? The Lord tells us in Ephesians 4:22-24 to "put off the old self, which belongs to our former manner of life when we were unbelievers and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of our minds, putting on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." In this day and age of cultural depravity and worldly darkness, I hope you acknowledge that we all need more Light, not just in the macro, meaning the church overall, but in the micro as well, meaning yourself. I hope you see the necessity of receiving more of Jesus, the Light of the world, in your life now. Christian pastor and theologian John Piper, author of Desiring God, writes, "The light of Christ is the brightness of God shining on the retina of the human soul." Receiving more Light, writes Piper, is essential. I hope you join me in praying, "Lord, I need more Light. Lord, I must have more Light. Jesus, I need more of You now."



I will also be teaching Children's CHE at a CHE Internship in Ghana--but no, I won't go this time; I will just give some online training.
- 5. Many people are suffering right now--in Turkey, in Syria, in Ukraine, in Russia, in many countries where Christians are persecuted, and with transitions and traumas. Pray for the love of Christ to penetrate into dark areas.
- 6. A correction--the cabin in Texas belongs to CHSC, on their mission property. They have started working on the foundation. Pray that the cabin will be a blessing to missionary families and to me.
- 7. Missionary kids are also at risk for abuse of different kinds. In March, I will go to Orlando for response team training with the Child Safety & Protection Network. Thank God for his provision of a plane ticket.
- 8. Thanks for your prayers for the Zihuatanejo ministries. Pray for a pastor to come alongside Ron with Ixtapa Christian Fellowship and for new house parents for Talita Cumi. And thank God for their faithful service over many years.
